On this date in 1777, the Second Continental Congress took a break from writing the Articles of Confederation and passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white" and that "the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation". Please show your patriotism by flying your American Flag.

Did you know that the first drive-in movie theater opened on June 6, 1933? Park-in Theaters, as they were called back then, was the idea of Richard Hollingshead, a movie fan and a sales manager at his father's company, Whiz Auto Products, in Camden, New Jersey. The idea was reportedly inspired by his mother's struggle to sit comfortably in a traditional movie theater. He came up with the idea of an open-air theater where patrons watched movies in the comfort of their own automobiles. Hollingshead experimented in the driveway of his own house with different projection and sound techniques, mounting a 1928 Kodak projector on the hood of his car, pinning a screen to some trees, and placing a radio behind the screen for sound. He also tested ways to guard against rain and other inclement weather, and

devised the ideal spacing arrangement for a number of cars so that all would have a view of the screen. He received a patent for the concept in May of 1933 and opened the Park-In Theaters, Inc. less than a month later. At this first Drive-in Theater, located in Pennsauken, New Jersey, viewers watched the British Fox comedy "Wives Beware". His initial investment was \$30,000. The price of admission was 25 cents for the car and 25 cents per person, with no family paying more than one dollar. The popularity spiked after World War II and reached its hevday in the late 1950s to mid-1960s, with some 5,000 theaters across the country. Since then, however, the rising cost of real estate, especially in suburban areas, combined with the rise of video rentals curbed the growth of the drive-in industry. fewer than 325 drive-in theaters survive in the United States. That first drive-in closed in 1940.

#### Left-handedness might be at least partly genetic

Left-handedness might be in your genes, according to a new study in the journal Nature Communications.

About 10 percent of the human population is left-handed, and those southpaws are 2.7 times more likely to have a rare variant of the gene TUBB4B. Study researchers reviewed the genetic composition of 350,000 people to draw their conclusions.

#### Association for Genealogy of the Transylvanian Saxons e. V.

The purpose of the Association for Genealogy of the Transylvanian Saxons e. V. Augsburg, VGSS for short, is the promotion of the maintenance of the Transylvanian-Saxon and cultural heritage as well as the collection of all data from the church registers and family books of the Evangelical Church A.B. in Romania, from pedigrees, ancestral passports and from other genealogical documents, in order to combine these as well as other already digitally recorded local family books (OFBs) and family constellations into a common database and to combine them in compliance with the legal provisions applicable in the Federal Republic of Germany (e.g. B. of the Data Protection Act) to an interested group of persons (e.g. B. family researchers, cultural scientists, historians) as well as to scientific institutions.

The association has the patronage of the project Genealogy of the Transylvanian Saxons, which carries out the electronic collection of the genealogical data, and the publication of the resulting genealogy database.

The association was founded on the 26th. June 2017. Founding members are: Krimhild Bonfert, Martin Buck, Bernd Eichhorn, Dr. Dietmar Gärtner, Waltraud Gross, Gerhard Rau, Georg Teutsch, Hugo Thiess, Jutta Tontsch and Christian Ungureanu. The following were elected to the board of the association:

Jutta Tontsch, 1. Chair Waltraud Gross, 2. Chair Krimhild Bonfert, treasurer Bernd Eichhorn, Secretary Dr. Dietmar Gärtner, IT Specialist

Gerhard Rau and Georg Teutsch were appointed as cash auditors.

On the 12th In October 2017, the association was registered in the commercial register in Augsburg. The recognition of the non-profit status was then applied for at the Augsburg tax office, which recognized it on 14.11.2017 as a "status of a corporation that pursues charitable purposes, namely: promotion of home care".





#### Genealogy of the Transylvanian Saxons, a living database

The Siebenbürgische Zeitung regularly reports on the project seminars under the patronage of the Verein für Genealogie der Siebenbürger Sachsen e.V. (VGSS). From the treasure of valuable information, which was thoroughly entered into the church registers of the Evangelical Church A.B. in Siebenburgen by the local pastors and preachers in Transylvania for centuries, an extensive electronic database https://vgss.de/genealogie-datenbank/ was created in this project over the course of several years.

A team of enthusiastic family researchers gradually deciphers the entries from the church registers in diligent detail and makes them accessible to all interested users of this platform on the Internet.

For many people, it is of great interest to learn information about their ancestors, to clarify family relationships with other people, to explore their own family history in the context of great historical events or to rediscover the essential characteristics of the living conditions of long-deserted homelands.

This also applies in particular to the Saxons of Transylvania and their descendants, no matter where in the world the touch of history has scattered them over time.

Thus, even descendants of Transylvanian emigrants worldwide now use the collected information of this platform for their family research.



In the year 2024, Father's Day is more meaningful than it ever was before.



#### Peonies: The 'flower of prosperity' thrives long after the gardener is gone

Peonies' huge blossoms and sweet scent bring memories of Grandma's garden. In fact, they might be the same plants. They are still flowering long after she passed, and may still be in bloom after you're gone.

Peonies were first cultivated 2,500 years ago in China, Siberia, and Japan. Descendants of the first plants can be found growing in the Midwest today.

In Japan, peonies are called the "flower of prosperity" because of their ability to thrive for decades in areas where the temperature regularly dips below zero in winter.

Master gardeners say the plants require stakes or ring supports to avoid damage from wind and rain. Planting them together in a sunny area is best because they are so beautiful in groups. To encourage large blooms, remove the smaller buds on each stem while they are tiny, leaving only the largest. When cutting, leave at least two leaves on each stem.

The older they get, the more peonies resent being moved, so choose a permanent location when planting. Some plants produce blooms for as long as 20 years before they need to be divided.



# GERMAN HISTORY COLUMBUS – RELIGION

While it wasn't one of the earliest Lutheran Churches in Columbus, we want to discuss it because of its relationship to Capital University.

Christ Lutheran Church began on February 19, 1871. Sixty people signed a document confessing their faith and this established the beginning of Christ Lutheran Church. Originally, Christ Church operated from a building on Goodale and High street. Christ Church eventually moved to the 4th floor of the Lehman Hall residential building of Capital University. Ironically, in the late 1960's I lived in Lehmann Hall on the 3rd floor. I did not know the history of Christ Church originally being located on the 4th floor. When I lived there the 4th floor was home to the fraternity KIL, and definitely their fraternity gave no resemblance to anything that would be associated to the Lutheran Christian Faith. This 4th floor location would serve as a chapel for daily worship servicethese services were in the morning and evenings. The services were conducted by Reverend F. Groth. Sunday services were in English and German conducted by President and Pastor William Lehmann (his name is prominent in so many of the Lutheran churches in Central Ohio) and a professor, usually CA Frank.



**Christ Lutheran Church** 

Early worshipers from the area, coming as far as from Canal Winchester (a 10 minute drive today but would have been a substantial drive with roads of the day) and students. By 1880, the church had relocated to its current site of 2314 E Main Street, Bexley, Ohio,

Bexley was experiencing substantial growth by the 1920's. The building committee headed by ambitious people like Ethridge Helsel and George Wannamacher helped arrange the purchase the Smith property at its current site. The contract for construction had to wait until the

#### **Croquet: the equal opportunity sport**

Some say croquet combines the skills of golf, billiards, and chess. Competitors have a passion for a game that looks genteel, but can be fiercely competitive.


The great thing about the croquet is that anyone can play. Young and old, men and women -- everyone competes on equal footing. There are no women's tees or handicaps. Former professional player Jim Welch called it a "thinking man's game," both challenging and exciting.

The idea of croquet is that team players use a mallet to hit a ball through wickets, six or nine, depending on your preference. The first team to hit through all the wickets wins.

These days croquet can be played on grass or carpet. Carpet croquet games have wickets that stand on the carpet with weights.

What's great about croquet is that it is not strenuous -- you can take a seat while the other guy is hitting -- but when it is your turn, you still get a few steps in before you knock the ball. It gives muscles a mild workout. It's also social, played with two to four other people.

Plus, it's fun. Trash talk is allowed -- "Knock him to the hills!"

The sport has stood the test of time, originating with 14th century French peasants, surviving and growing in popularity over the centuries. Croquet equipment was advertised in the New York Clipper in 1862. One New York paper editorialized, "never in the history of outdoor sports in this country has any game achieved so sudden a popularity." The U.S. Croquet Association carries rules for backyard nine-wicket, American six-wicket, international six-wicket, and nine-wicket golf croquet.

Whichever you choose, you'll have a great time playing -- that is, unless you are the victim of being 'knocked into the far hills."

treasury contained \$ 30,000. The sanctuary was completed at the cost of \$ 93,000. The congregation would struggle to pay over the next 20 years. The calling of Dr. Otto Ebert on December 1, 1929 would be the last time that the church would need to seek approval from Capital University for appointment of their pastor.

Christ Lutheran Church continues to strive today, serving the Bexley community and Capital University.

The final Lutheran Church we will discuss is Martin Luther Church. Its creation was the result of mostly immigrants from various cities, villages and communes of their homeland and heritage of Transylvanian Saxons. This will occur in the next article on German in Central Ohio.
