Summer is rapidly approaching and the ATS Youth Activities Committee is once again sponsoring Saxon Summer Camp, for our Junior Members and friends, ages 7 – 17, the opportunity to spend a week together in fellowship. This year we are extending the ages from 7 - 17 by offering four camp programs for the different ages. The programs are designed to allow campers to continue to grow, every time they move to a new age group the type and level of activities increase to meet the needs of that age group:

New Adventurers – Ages 7– 8 Songs, creek stumping, hiking, swimming, crafts, discovery time, camp fires and more.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$155 and \$280 for non-member children.

Discoverers – Ages 9–11 Traditional camp activities plus climbing tower and archery.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$170 and \$295 for non-member children

Journeyers – Ages 12-14 Includes traditional camp activities plus canoeing, high rope courses and zip line.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$225 and \$350 for non-member children

Ultimate Challenge – Ages 15–17 Includes camping out at Ohiopyle, Pa, go whitewater rafting and caving at Laurel Caverns.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$300 and \$425 for non-member children

The one week camp will be held at Camp Frederick, a beautiful camp located in Rogers, Ohio on 144 acres of forest, rambling streams, rolling hills, glacial rocks and meadows. Camp Frederick is an organized camp center located at the Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia border. The camp is located 1 ½ miles east of Rogers, Ohio off SR 154. The address is 6996 Millrock Road. The camp is staffed with trained and experienced counselors.

At Camp Frederick our campers will be housed in Cabins which accommodate eight persons.

One evening will be devoted to Saxon folk dancing and folklore.

We welcome our members to bring along one friend who is not a member. Also, ATS members may send their children or grandchildren (who are not yet ATS members) to the camp at the non-member cost. Each Camper will receive a free Saxon Summer Camp T-Shirt.

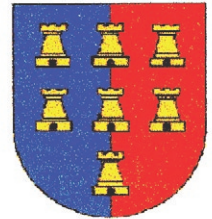

EINTRACHT SAXONIA SACHSENCHOR SPRING CONCERT



Am 10. Mai 2015 ist Muttertag

Wie bei vielen unserer heutigen Feste und Ehrentage ist deren Ursprung schon im Altertum zu finden.

Die Uhrmutter bei den alten Griechen war die Göttin Rhea (Rhea bedeutet: Fluss des Lebens), Tochter des Uranus und der Gaea, und Mutter aller Gottheiten und Göttinnen.

Der zu ihren Ehren entstandene Mutterkult wurde im Rahmen eines grossen Frühlingsfestes gefeiert.

Dazu ist in der Encyclopaedia Britannica (1959, Bd. 15, S. 849) zu lesen:

„Ein Fest, das von dem Brauch des Mutterkults im alten Griechenland abgeleitet wurde. Ein förmlicher Mutterkult mit Zeremonien für Kybele oder Rhea, die grosse Göttermutter, wurde an den Iden des März in ganz Kleinasien getrieben.“

Im England des 13. Jahrhunderts wurde der Sonntag Laetare als „mothering Sunday“ begangen, an dem man der Mutter Kirche für ihre Mutterschaft dankte und infolgedessen auch der lieblichen Mutter Dank abstattete.

Schon um 1644 wurde berichtet: „Every Mid-Lent Sunday is a great day at Worcester, when all the children and grandchildren meet at the head and chief of the family and have a feast. They call it Mothering Day.“

Der hier gemeinte Sonntag (Laetare) wurde von auswärts lebenden Kinder genutzt um die Eltern zu besuchen (go a-mothering) und sich bei der Mutter mit kleinen Geschenken zu bedanken. In Thüringen war Laetare (Mittfastensonntag) allgemeiner Besuchstag mit grosszügiger Bewirtung von Verwandten.

Ähnliche Traditionen sind aus der Champagne und aus Wallonien bekannt.

Schon Frankfurts Dicherfürst Johann Wolfgang von Goethe schrieb quasi als Hommage an seine Mutter.

„Vom Vater hab' ich die Statur,
des Lebens ernstes Führen,
vom Mütterchen die Frohnatur,
die Lust zu fabulieren.“

Und ein altes Volksgut bringt die Mutterliebe wie folgt zum Ausdruck:

Lebe glücklich,
lebe heiter,
lebe in Gesundheit weiter,
lebe viele Jahre noch!
Lebe Mutter, lebe hoch!

Woher kommt der Muttertag?

1872 trat die Schriftstellerin und Frauenrechtlerin Julia Ward Howe mit der Forderung, daß amerikanischen Müttern ein offizieller Feiertag gebühre, an die Öffentlichkeit.

Anna Jarvis aus Philadelphia griff die Idee wieder auf und feierte am 9. Mai 1907 – dem 2. Todestag ihrer Mutter – einen Dankes-Gottesdienst in der Kirche ihres Heimatortes Grafton/West Virginia.

Zudem startete sie eine Initiative für die Einführung eines offiziellen Feiertags zu Ehren der Mütter.

Startete der „Mother's Day“ 1908 zunächst nur in Philadelphia, uebernahmen im darauffolgenden Jahr bereits 45 amerikanische Staaten diesen Gedenktag.

Der Werbefeldzug war letztlich von Erfolg gekrönt, als Präsident Woodrow Wilson am 8. Mai 1914 Muttertag für jeden zweiten Sonntag im Mai zum nationalen Ehrentag erklärte.

Neben dem Brauch, an diesem Tage eine farbige Nelke zu Ehren der lebenden Mütter zu tragen oder eine weisse in Angedenken für die bereit Verstorbenen, setzte sich von da an auch das Versenden oder Übergeben von Muttertagskarten durch.

Nach dem Ersten Weltkrieg konnte sich der Muttertag auch auf dem europäischen Festland durchsetzen.

Zuerst in der Schweiz (1917) und in Skandinavien (1918/19), 1923 dann auch in Deutschland, wo er pikanterweise durch den Verband Deutscher Blumengeschäftsinhaber etabliert wurde.

Im „Dritten Reich“ erklärten 1933 die Nationalsozialisten den Familienfesttag zum Staatsfeiertag (Zweiter Sonntag im Mai) und mißbrauchten ihn fuer ihre Mutterkult-Ideologie.

Mit der Gründung der Bundesrepublik 1949 wurde der Muttertag wieder ein rein privater Feiertag.

In der ehemaligen DDR wurde der Muttertag nicht offiziell begangen. Er wurde durch den Internationalen Frauentag am 8. März ersetzt.

Hinweis: Heute wird der 2. Sonntag im Mai als Muttertag begangen. Sollte der Muttertag allerdings auf den Pfingstsonntag fallen, kann der Muttertag auf den vorherigen Sonntag verlegt werden.

Allerdings wurde der Muttertag in 2008, obwohl er auf den Pfingstsonntag viel, nicht verschoben.

Auch heutzutage werden zum Muttertag immer noch mehr Blumen verschenkt als zum Valentinstag.

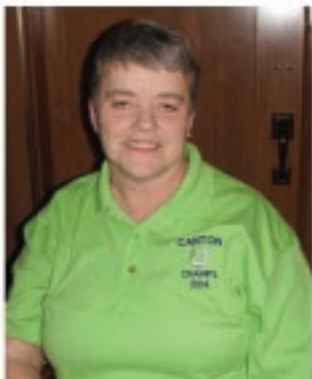
