In Memoriam: Johann Paal † 1932 – 2012

We sadly report the passing of Brother Johann Paal, President of the Siebenbürger Sachsen Sängerbund. He died on February 24, 2012 at the Jameson Memorial Hospital in New Castle, Pa.

Johann Paal
Johann was born on May 15, 1932 to
the late Georg and Rosina Gierling Paal
in Kreisch, Siebenbürgen. He married
his wife, Elisabeth, on May 1, 1960. They
were blessed with two children, Anneliese
(Stephen) Schneider and Hans-Werner
(Cindy) Paal.

He loved singing with New Castle's Eintracht Männerchor and was respected as a leader of the Siebenbürger Sachsen Sängerbund for many years. He was a former member of the TSBA and always enjoyed Gemütlichkeit with his Saxon friends. Besides singing and bowling, he enjoyed beekeeping, woodworking and dancing.

Johann's funeral service was held at Christ Lutheran Church in New Castle on February 29, 2012. During the service, John Boehm, Jr., 3rd Vice President of the Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons, remembered Johann with the following:

"All of us at this funeral service for Johann Paal knew him to be a loving husband and

good father. An honest man who also loved song and merriment. I remember him most for his love of the German language---forgive me---the German and the Transylvanian Saxon language. So on this somber occasion allow a few words in German."

"The German poet Goethe tells us that no matter when or where or even why, death is never a welcomed guest. And he continues with a philosophical view on life that:

Wer nie sein Brot mit Tränen aß, wer nie die kummervollen Nächte auf seinem Bette weinend saß, der kennt euch nicht ihr himmlischen Mächte. Ihr führt ins Leben uns hinein. Ihr last den Armen schuldig warden. Dann überlasst ihr der Pein, Den alle Schuld rächt sich auf Erden.

Fortunate is he who never ate his bread with tears and never sat troubled upon his bed at night. No, he does not know your heavenly mights. You lead us into life and let the poor wretch become burdened, only to leave him to his pain because all indebtedness is paid for while on earth."

"Today our Brother Johann suffers no more pain. His earthly life is over. Let us take a page out of his book so that when our day will come---as it surely will---people will say of us what we now say of Johann: Well done thou good and faithful servant. Thank you for your service to your fellow man, and our Siebenbürger Sachsen in particular.

Ruhe sanft! Rest in Peace! Aufwiedersehen until we meet again."



SAXON HANDICRAFT EXHIBIT

A highlight of the ATS Convention is the Saxon Handicraft Exhibit. The Exhibit this year will be held at the Youngstown Saxon Club, where the ATS Convention will meet on June 2 - 3, 2012.

The Junior Category, which allows our junior members, ages 13 and under, to exhibit their handcrafted items in an open category, will once again be a part of the Exhibit. All members competing in this category will receive a small token of appreciation.

The Handicraft Exhibit provides an opportunity to display articles which relate to our Transylvanian Saxon cultural background, but is not restricted to this category only. It is a showplace for the artistic talents and abilities of our people, present and past.

A prize competition is held for items made by present ATS Members only. The rules for this prize competition are as follows:

- 1. There will be prize competition in ten (10) categories.
- 2. There will be first and second prizes awarded in each category.
- 3. There will be one (1) President's Award for "Best of Show" Entry.

- 4. No more than three (3) entries allowed per member.
- 5. Only items actually made by present ATS members, ages 14 and over, are eligible

for entry in this prize competition.

- 6. Winning entries will be determined by ballot vote of the Convention Delegates.
- 7. There will be a separate Junior Category for ATS members, Ages 13 and under.

NOTE: An Entry Blank must be filled out for all items placed on display. Advance registration will be appreciated. The exhibit room will be opened Saturday morning (June 2nd) for delivery and set-up of display items. All items must be picked up Sunday morning (June 3rd) prior to the start of the Sunday Convention Session.

On June 4th 1922, a young missionary held his first service at the West Side Sachsenheim. One month later, Reverend John Foisel organized St. John's Lutheran Church, or as it was called "Siebenbuergische Saechsiche Evangelisch Lutherische St. Johannes Kirche." In September of 1922, the congregation was able to purchase property and build a church on Eddy Road in Cleveland. On September 7, 1924, the cornerstone was laid on the first church to be built by Transvlvanian Saxons in the United States. The church was dedicated by Pastor Foisel in December of 1924.

Presently, we hold our monthly meetings at St. John's in Highland Heights. This church, founded by members of the old St. John's on Eddy Road, was dedicated in February of 1963, and this fall will be celebrating its 90th anniversary. Plans for the celebration are in the works, and will be published at a later date.





Seniors can manage income to minimize taxes

As many seniors discover, retirement can be frustrating when it comes to paying taxes.

With 401ks, traditional and Roth IRAs, as well as Social Security benefits and working wages, there's a lot to calculate on a tax return. Paying less in taxes starts with managing your money.

Retirement plan withdrawals

Most experts advise delaying withdrawals from a 401(k) or traditional IRA until you are 70 1/2 or older. This allows those plans to grow tax-deferred. Taxes on withdrawals are eventually taxed as ordinary income.

If withdrawals are taken before age 59 1/2, you pay a 10 percent penalty.

This is where a Roth IRA can help. Funds from a Roth can be withdrawn by age 59 tax free, if they've been open for at least five years.

Because contributions to a Roth are after-tax dollars, you won't be taxed on that money when you withdraw it. You will have to pay taxes only on the interest your money earned.

Some retirees consider moving to a state that has low or no income taxes, such as Nevada and Florida. That might not pay off, since many states are considering enacting state income taxes or raising the income tax rate.

Social Security benefits are taxed if a person has substantial income from wages, dividends or interest. The combined income for the tax is \$44,000 for couples and as little as \$25,000 for some individuals.

In 2012, individuals whose unearned income tops \$200,000 will have to pay a 3.9 percent Medicare tax.

Avoiding messy paint cans

Wappe von Kronstadt

Ergebnisse der Volkszählung vermutlich ungenau

Bukarest – Die Zahl der Deutschen in Rumänien verzeichnete im vergangenen Jahrzehnt einen Rückgang auf 36900. Über die vorläufigen Ergebnisse der Volkszählung vom Herbst 2011 hat <u>diese</u> Zeitung berichtet.

Von dem sinkenden Trend gibt es jedoch zwei Ausnahmen, und zwar die Verwaltungskreise Buzău und Ilfov mit einem Zuwachs von 37 auf 132 bzw. von 90 auf 109 Deutsche. Auch in anderen Kreisen und Ortschaften Rumäniens könnten die Zahlen um einiges höher sein als aus den Zensusergebnissen hervorgeht.

Vergleicht man beispielsweise die Ergebnisse für Kronstadt mit der Seelenzahl in den Gemeinden des evangelischen

Kirchenbezirks A.B., so entdeckt man beachtliche Unterschiede: Die Stadt Kronstadt verzeichnet laut Volkszählung 1079 Deutsche, hingegen zählen die Honterusgemeinde und die Bartholomäer Kirchengemeinde insgesamt 1253 Mitglieder. Noch größer sind die Differenzen für Zeiden (205 Deutsche laut Volkszählung, 437 Seelen in der evangelischen Gemeinde) und Fogarasch (181 versus 299). Traditionsgemäß sind die meisten Gemeindeglieder der Evangelischen Kirche A.B. in Rumänien zugleich auch Angehörige der deutschen Minderheit.



When you are married but you don't have a spouse. What then?

They had a wonderful, loving marriage for 30 years before she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. Now he's her caregiver, though she doesn't recognize him and doesn't

When his helper comes in the afternoon, he sometimes kisses his wife goodbye and goes to visit a woman he met at church. They have a close relationship.

With the rise of age-related cognitive diseases, men and women who care for their affected partners are often finding companionship outside of marriage.

Some 5.4 million Americans have Alzheimer's, and the number is rising. Add other forms of dementia, and it's a large population. Their caregivers crave intimacy with another person but carry a burden of guilt because, legally, they are still married.

One rabbi says longevity has created new life stages and it's a challenge to adapt to the new realities.

Evangelist Pat Robertson says he can't fault a person for wanting some kind of relationship. The person he or she loved for decades is gone.

At the Center for Bioethics at the University of Pennsylvania, ethicists say as long as they make sure the affected partner is cared for, they are entitled to at least seek companionship.

New love isn't just found by the well partner. Sometimes dementia patients in nursing homes form romantic bonds, unaware that they are married. It can be difficult for the well spouse, but as one doctor says, it's not personal, it's the disease.

Lonely caregivers who believe dating is unacceptable should search for a platonic companionship, experts

For their own mental health, they need to get out of the house and be around people, whether they are old friends or old flames.

Irish-American Heritage Month:

New York's St. Patrick's Day Parade to honor all American veterans

The New York St. Patrick's Day parade is the world's largest. and longest. This year's Grand Marshall is NBC executive Francis. X. Comerford. He traces his Irish ancestry to County Kilkenny.

The 2012 parade, which includes representation of every clan, is New York's 251st St. Patrick's Day Parade.

This year, it will be marched in honor of all American veterans. from every branch of service and every war or conflict.

During the month of March, nearly 40 million Americans who trace their

roots back to Ireland celebrate their history, and the contributions of their immigrant ancestors, through dancing, songs, humor and especially with parades. St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, died on March 17, 491 B.C. The Irish commemorate his death with many festivities each year.

Americans will consume over 26 billion pounds of corned beef, 2 billion pounds of cabbage, and spend \$25 million on lime green chrysanthemums.

St. Patrick's Day is not a national holiday, but green was the symbolic color traditionally worn by everyone who didn't want to be "pinched."

Why green? The Irish call heaven "Green Erin" and their country. the 'Emerald Island,' nicknames given because of the clover that covers much of it. Saint Patrick was the first to use the 3-leaf clover, a Shamrock, to illustrate the doctrine of the Trinity. Green is used on flags, banners, clothing and in dyed beer.

Irish is the most frequently reported ancestry in the United States (12 percent of our population), trailed by German, Nine of our towns are named Dublin and four are named Shamrock.
