Presidents Day is a holiday celebrated annually on the third Monday in February. It was originally established in 1885 in recognition of President George Washington and is still officially called "Washington's Birthday" by the federal government.

Traditionally celebrated on February 22, Washington's actual day of birth, the holiday became popularly known as Presidents Day after it was moved as part of 1971's Uniform Monday Holiday Act, an attempt to create more three-day weekends for the nation's workers.

While several states had individual holidays honoring the birthdays of Washington, Abraham Lincoln and others, Presidents Day is now viewed as a day to celebrate all U.S. presidents past and present. - 111

## STOCK MARKET BULLS AND BEARS



### Bulls and bears tell their stock market predictions for 2014

The bulls have been ram-paging through Wall Street for five years and the pessimists say, if you are not in the party now, it's too late to join.

Quoted in USA Today, Barry Bannister, chief equity strategist at Stifel, says he is not a bear, but the upward trend in stocks won't continue. He predicts a leveling out of prices in 2014.

Meanwhile at JPMorgan Chase, the chief equity strategist predicts rising stock prices for at least another year.

Blogger Toby Connor of Gold Scents says the market is ripe to reverse and appears to be in a bubble of overvaluation caused by the Fed. Connor recommends individuals save their money until stock prices correct and buy low.

At the end of November, 2013, the Standard & Poor's 500 stock index was up by 25.4 percent and topped 1800 for the first time. It posted 36 record closes, the most since 1998.

The average year-end price target of 13 strategists polled by Bloomberg Businessweek was 1890. By now, we know whether they hit the target or not. Either way, the S&P did very well in 2013. He predicts a 13 percent gain in 2014.

Bannister predicts that the S&P will stand at 1750 at the end of 2013. John Stoltzfus, chief investment strategist at Oppenheimer, was positive. He says the stock market will receive support from the ongoing migration of investors' cash from bonds to stocks. And stocks are more attractively priced than bonds. He expects the S&P 500 to grow profits at 5.5 percent in 2014.

Stoltzfus doesn't believe the Federal Reserve's bond-buying program, or quantitative easing (QE) is responsible for 2013 stock market gains and says it just primed the well of the U.S. economy. He says the market will be able to avoid relapse when the Fed starts dialing back on its stimulus.

### Exercise: a powerful tool for avoiding decline

Pumping iron is no longer just an activity for young men. Women in their 70s and 80s have taken it up to maintain or increase their strength and fight cognitive decline.

The weights they use are determined at first by what they can lift and how often.

According to Tufts University, both aerobic activity and resistance training helped prevent decline in thinking.

Tufts reports research in which 86 women ages 70 to 86 were divided into two exercise groups. One group trained twice a week with machines and free weights.

The second group was assigned to aerobic exercise, which was mainly an outdoor walking program, and the third performed only balance and stretching exercises.

Mental performance was measured using the Stroop Test for selective attention, and the ability to deal with conflicting information. The test also involved problem solving, visual attention and task switching.

After six months on the program, the aerobics group and stretching group got physically fitter and improved balance.

Those who lifted weights and did resistance training significantly improved their average performance on the Stroop Test and tests of associative memory.

## When to start Social Security? Depends on how long you think you'll live

It's a widely publicized fact that if you wait to retire until age 70, you will get 132 percent of your normal Social Security benefit (each month for the rest of your life).

At age 62, you would get 75 percent of your normal benefit. Each year you wait from 62 on increases the benefit by 8 percent.

At the recommended retirement age of 66, you would get 100 percent of your benefit.

Waiting until age 70 sounds like a wise decision, says Fortune magazine expert Allan Sloan. His analysis, however, shows that there's way more to consider, including life expectancy.

He writes that if you think you'll make it to your mid-80s or longer, you would do better to wait until age 70 to start collecting. That's because, if you wait to collect 132 percent of your benefit at age 70, it will take 12 1/2 years for that extra 32 percent to equal the four years of benefits you would have collected by starting at 66. In other words, if you live to at least 83, you win. If you don't, you lose.

Then there is the basic mortality risk: If you decide to wait until age 70 to start taking your benefits but you die at 69 years and 11 months, or before, you (and your survivors) will get nothing. It's what's known as mortality risk.

Sloan writes that both of his parents died in their 70s. So he and his wife decided to start taking his Social Security retirement benefits at age 67.

He will invest all or part of his benefits into dividend-paying stocks that pay 4 percent to 5 percent interest.

Incidentally, according to Fortune, Social Security doesn't care when you start taking your money. People taking smaller amounts for longer periods cost the system the same as people taking higher payments for shorter periods of time. They've got it figured out.

## Chili con carne chases the inner chill of a cold February day

If you've lived this long without cooking up a big pot of homemade chili con carne, put it on the menu for this weekend. Yes, it's the Spanish way of saying "pepper and meat," but people from coast to coast and several countries have prepared and eaten chili for decades. Maybe even centuries.

It's basically a meat stew. Controversy over the ingredients of a great chili is unending. At world chili cook-offs, chefs, judges and samplers argue over whose chili recipe is the best. Tex-Mex is probably the most well-known bowl of red, but it's a personal taste. Beans or no beans. Tomatoes or no tomatoes. Ground beef or cubed beef chuck roast. Chili powder or a mixture of fresh chilies.

Here's a recipe that requires only beginner cooking skill, that both kids and adults will eat with gusto. Change the degree of hotness by adding more cumin or chilies and the thickness by adding cooking time.

### Chili con carne with or without beans

- 2 pounds 90 percent lean ground beef
- 2 medium white onions, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon dried ground cumin
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- 2 tablespoons Ancho chili powder
- 2 whole chipotles canned in



en adobo sauce, stems and seeds removed, finely chopped

2 tablespoons en adobo sauce

Coarse salt and black pepper to taste

2 cans (14 1/2 oz.) petite diced tomatoes and juice

2 cans (14 1/2 ounce) cans beef broth

1-2 tablespoons molasses, to cut acidity of tomatoes

2 cans (14 1/2 oz.) kidney beans, rinsed and drained

In a large soup pot or cast-iron Dutch oven, over medium heat, sauté the onions until translucent, add the garlic and stir 30 seconds.

Add ground beef and sauté until gray in color. Add cumin, oregano, chili powder, chipotles, salt, pepper, tomatoes, and beef broth. Reduce heat to low and simmer, covered, approximately 3 to 4 hours, stirring often.

Add molasses and beans (if desired), and simmer for another 30 minutes.

Serve in individual bowls. Garnish with chopped green onions, sour cream and shredded cheese or corn chips.

Makes 8 to 12 servings.
