It's a fact: Good lung function helps you think better

A new Swedish study published in the journal Psychological Science, shows that the brain's processing speed is better maintained with good lung health.

The researchers now believe that oxygen intake carried throughout the body by the blood may affect chemicals that transmit signals between brain cells. They say regular exercise and a healthy diet enhance oxygen-rich blood flow.

The study included 832 people 50 to 85 who were followed for 19 years.

One bit of good news: the study found that reduced lung function was not linked with worsened memory or loss of stored knowledge in the brain.

TARRAGON AND BEAN SOUP PFEFFERKRAUT AND BOHNEN SUPPE

1 lb. pork or ham
1 c. white beans
Water
1 tsp. tarragon
1 onion
1 carrot
Salt

Thickening:
1 Tbsp. flour
Vinegar
Pepper
Cream or milk
1 egg

Cook meat and beans until tender in water to cover well. Salt to taste. Add finely cut onion, carrot and tarragon and boil 10 minutes. Make thickening in a small bowl, using flour, dash of pepper and enough cream or milk to thin. A beaten egg may be added. Add the thickening slowly to soup, stirring constantly to prevent lumping. Add a little vinegar to taste and stir to a boil. If the soup is too thick, add a little milk or cream.

GREEN BEAN SOUP 2 GRUENE BOHNEN SUPPE

Green beans
1 clove of garlic
1 sprig parsley
2 slices bacon

3 Tbsp. flour
Chopped onion
Sour cream
Vinegar

Cook until tender a pot full of nice young green beans in mildly salted water with garlic and parsley. Fry bacon. Remove from frying pan when crisp. To hot bacon grease, add some chopped onion and flour, stirring until brown and smooth. Add some of the water from the beans slowly, stirring constantly to prevent lumps. Cook a bit, then add this thickening to soup and bring to a boil. Add crisp bacon, sour cream and vinegar to taste. Serve with a little chopped parsley if desired.
