Inspired by these decades of state and local celebrations, Flag Day was officially established by President Woodrow Wilson on May 30, 1916. President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th each year as National Flag Day.

The 'Fish Story' gets better



The proven benefits of eating fish seem to be growing all the time, say researchers at Tufts University. Still, too many Americans don't take advantage of the benefits of fish. Consider this:

They feed your brain. MRI scans show that people eating broiled or baked fish on a weekly basis had greater volumes of gray matter in the areas responsible for memory and learning. Over a 10-year period, they were less likely to have developed Alzheimer's disease.

Omega-3s have big benefits for your heart. The omega-3 fatty acids in fish have long been known to protect the heart. They can lower triglycerides, improve blood pressure, prevent the blood clots that trigger heart attacks and strokes, and reduce heart arrhythmia, which is the leading cause of sudden cardiac death.

Eating fish can protect your eyes. Starting now, you can lower your risk of age-related macular degeneration (AMD) in later life.

Research on the 38,022 participants in the Women's Health Study linked regular consumption of fish over a 10-year period with being 42 percent less likely to develop AMD. Study subjects ate fish once a week, but twice a week is now recommended.

Fish that are rich in omega-3s include salmon, anchovies, herring, sardines, Pacific oysters, trout, and mackerel. A four-ounce serving of wild salmon contains about as much as the weekly omega-3 recommendation calls for.

Whether you eat these or other types, it's better to eat more fish than less fish. Broiled, baked and canned fish have fewer calories than pan fried or deep fried fish.

Happy Fathers Day!

Great fathers are like great sportsmen who hone their skills and become experts at their crafts.

So says Coach Tony Dungy, and his words are worth remembering.

In his classic article written in 2002, Dungy said, "As we study all-pro dads, we discover that they share four patterns. They spend time with their children; they are compassionate toward their children; and they love and respect their children's mother and they turn to their faith for strength.

"A compassionate father is patient with his children. He doesn't expect them to be perfect, and he tries to empathize by putting himself in their shoes. His love is unconditional, and he lets them know it."

The importance of the father in the home is shockingly apparent in statistics on juve-

nile delinquency.

In a classic 1990 study of teen criminality, the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development found an 'alarmingly high' prevalence of behavioral problems among all children from families without a father present.

Bureau of Justice Statistics found that 72 percent of incarcerated juveniles grew up in one-parent homes, mostly deprived of a father.

Non-resident fathers remain crucial to child development. Involved non-resident fathers help improve children's grades and promote better social and behavioral skills.

Bottom line: Dads are essential for families and society. On June 17, it's time to say Thanks Dad!

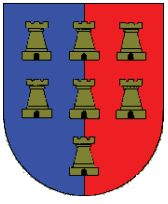

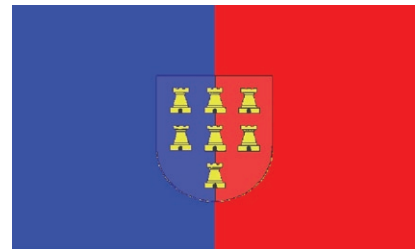

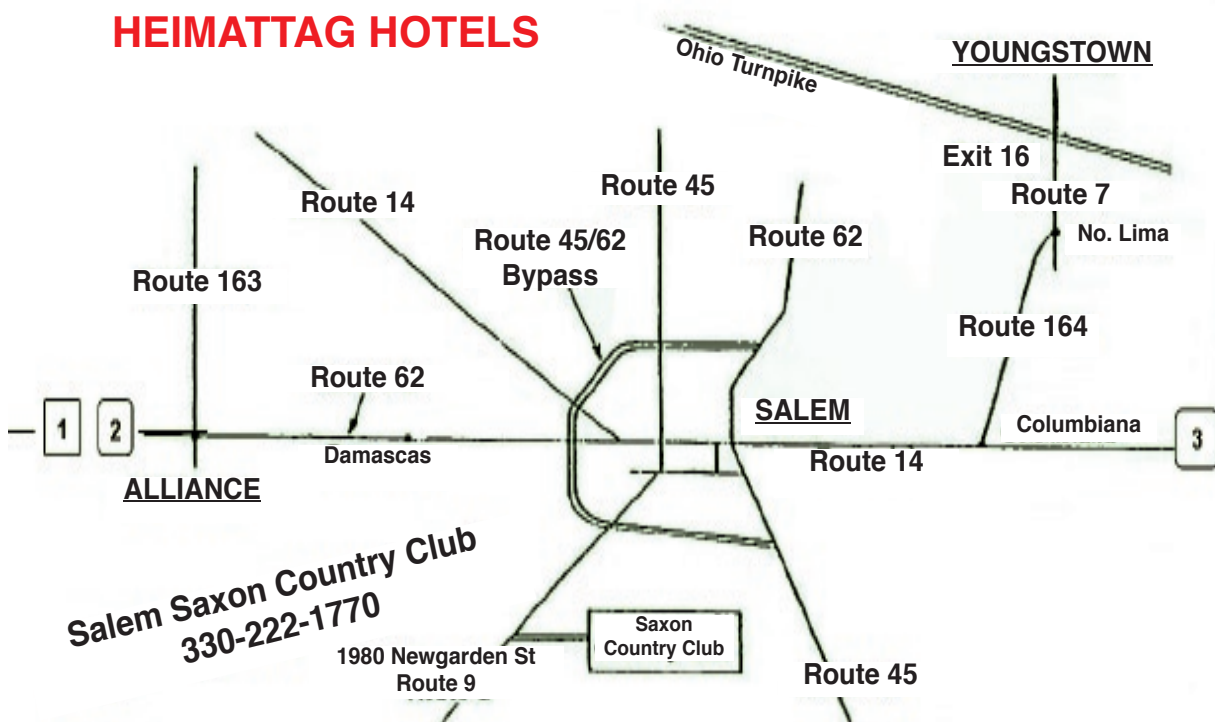
