On Friday, August 22nd, 2014 ATS Trustees and ATS Treasurer Denise Aeling-Crawford performed our annual audit. They found the books to be accurate and in good order. The committee thanked the Home Office staff for their help with the audit.

On Saturday, August 23rd, the ATS Board of Directors met for their regularly scheduled meeting. The Board welcomed newly elected ATS Trustee, Randall Floyd, to his first Board meeting. Many issues were discussed at length and committee reports were presented and voted upon. One important issue that was discussed was the current rate of interest which the ATS is paying on our Annuity Contracts. The Board voted that the interest rate remain unchanged.

I often remind members of changes they neglect to make in a timely manner. Please take the time to update the names of beneficiaries on your Life Insurance Policies and Annuity Certificates. Many events take place in our lives that require changes, such as deaths, marriage, divorce, or maybe adding additional beneficiaries. If this information is not kept up to date, it can cause avoidable delay in processing a claim. The Home Office should also be promptly notified of any member's change of address or change of name. A form for this purpose is often printed in the *Volksblatt*. For other changes, please telephone the Home Office and our staff will be glad to assist you.

To reduce stress Some age 50s plan to change careers

A study by Life Reimagined and USA Today shows that almost one-third of pre-retirees plan to change careers in the next five years.

After decades in the workforce, they want to swap stress for more work-life balance. In fact, 32 percent of respondents who are employed or looking for work have already gone through a major career shift. The most common reason is a desire to do something different. And the change isn't about money.

Some executives are going into teaching. One man retired from a corporation to become an emergency medical technician and says he feels like he's giving something back. Others say they no longer want to work overtime or do the same work every day; 75 to 80 percent say the want to do work they love, make their lives more meaningful, travel, or pursue other interests.


Eat That Chocolate

Good news for chocolate lovers! Recent studies have shown that there are more benefits to eating chocolate than we knew. A recent small trial found that eating chocolate helped those with peripheral artery disease, which impairs blood circulation, walk longer on a treadmill. People who eat chocolate cut their risk for heart failure by as much as a third. It can also lower blood pressure and reduce your risk of heart attack and stroke by 39 percent.

But not so fast! Before you grab a chocolate bar, you should know that these results come largely from studies involving dark chocolate, not milk

chocolate. There are components in dark chocolate that come from cacao, which is packed with healthy chemicals like flavonoid, polyphenols, and theobromine. The more cacao content, the healthier the chocolate. So stick with chocolate that is at least 70 percent cacao for the best benefit.

Eating dark chocolate consistently is the best strategy. You should try in include about seven to eight ounces of dark chocolate in your diet each week for the maximum benefit. Any more than that and you will be adding more calories without much increase in health benefits.

ATS OPEN-BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. All bowlers must be Alliance of Transylvanian Saxon members in good standing to participate in this tournament.
- Each bowler will receive 100% of the difference between his or her average and a two hundred ten (210) scratch with no limit on pins.
- Averages to be used are:
 - a) The average of the past five years' tournaments.
 - b) If the bowler has no tournament average then the bowler will establish his or her average after the first three games rolled in the tournament, which will remain the bowler's average for the remainder of the tournament.
- A bowler may bowl only once in each event in this tournament.
- The tournament management has the right to return for correction any entry, which does not comply with the above rules.







Social Media and the Elderly

Social media is often criticized for its tendency to isolate people behind their computer screens, limiting their face-toface, real world interactions. But for one group, Americans 65 and older, it can have a different effect.

A recent Michigan State University study showed that Internet use by those of retirement age actually reduces the chances of depression by more than 30 percent. This comes from an increased ability to communicate and stay connected with friends and family who may not live nearby. Those living alone showed the greatest reduction in depression rates.

But the researchers stressed that, as in all things, moderation is the key. The best way to stay connected with your social network is a combination of social media use and actually being with your loved ones. In this way, social media enhances your connections rather than replacing them.

Seasonal treat for any meal

Apple season can vary depending upon the weather and the region of the orchard. A harsh and long winter can slow the blossoming of trees in the spring and an unexpected freeze can zap the buds and delay the growth and

That's why National Apple Month begins in late September and extends through November.

Apples are grown in and Alaska and include 2,500 known varieties. Whatever region we live in, apple-picking, roadside stands and markets featuring a dozen varieties are usually good sources because we've got special family recipes that taste best with apples fresh from the tree.

About 100 apple varieties are grown commercially in the United States, but 90 percent consist of the 15 most popular, in-



cluding Gala, Granny Smith, every state except Hawaii and Red Delicious. Though our recipes tend to focus on desserts or salads, here's one that combines the savory taste of sausage with the sweet flavor of apple, perfect for any meal.

Sausage-filled baked apples

1 pound bulk pork sausage 6 large tart baking apples Macintosh, (Braburn, Honey Crisp)

- 1 small apple
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon grated lemon rind 2 tablespoons light or dark raisins Extra brown sugar, ground cinnamon, grated lemon rind.

Preheat oven to 375 de-

Brown the sausage in a large skillet. Wash the apples; cut a slice from the tops; scoop out the cores and enough flesh to leave a 1/2 inch shell. Peel and finely dice the smallest apple.

To the sausage, add the diced apple, raisins, brown sugar, cinnamon, and lemon rind and mix well. Fill the apple shells with the mix-

Sprinkle the tops with additional brown sugar, cinnamon, and lemon rind. Place in a baking dish, cover with foil, and bake until tender, about 40 minutes. Then serve with biscuits or croissants and apple jelly.

Als Gymnasiallehrer lebte er mit seiner Familie in Agnetheln und siedelte 1987 nach Deutschland aus, wo er in Herzogenaurach bis zu seinem Tode 1990 lebte.

In Agnetheln schrieb Heinrich Oczko zu verschiedenen Anlässen für "Kränzchen", Nachbarschaft und Verwandtschaft eine beachtliche Anzahl von Gelegenheitsversen, darunter einiges auch in Mundart. 1969 bis 1983 war er Urzelsprecher und schrieb seine Reden ebenfalls in Versen, auch in Rumänisch, als es auf Deutsch noch nicht erlaubt war. In den 1970er Jahren begleitete er die Agnethler Blaskapelle als Moderator der Konzerte und ging überall, wo die sächsischen Ortschaften Spitznamen hatten, auf deren Entstehungsgeschichte oder sonst wie Verbindungen dazu ein. Für das Konzert der Blaskapelle 1979 in Mediasch entstand dieser Text Medwesch.
