How will you celebrate our nation's 393rd Thanksgiving?

By the first day of November, most of us are already thinking about the 27th, the quintessential national holiday that brings family and friends together for fellowship and feasting. Thanksgiving Day is always on the fourth Thursday, and regardless of our heritage, we're given the opportunity to voice appreciation for our blessings.

For some of us, the day is steeped in tradition, which means we take out Grandma's damask tablecloth and our rarely used china and silver. We might decorate the table with fall's harvest of vegetables tumbling from a cornucopia or with chrysanthemums.

When everyone is seated, we carry in the gleaming silver platter heaped high with the perfectly roasted and succulent turkey surrounded by greens, a sight to behold and a memory that will keep the tradition alive.

Turkey is the main dish for 91 percent of Americans, but traditional side dishes have evolved over the years. Corn, yams, cranberries and pumpkin pie usually remain on the menu, because of our vision of the first Thanksgiving in 1621. But home chefs in every region of the country and many newer immigrant nationalities have given them their special twist.

The diversity of our cuisines

elevates the basics of sweet potato pie or latkes, oyster dressing, cornbread pudding, pumpkin tortellini, flan or empanadas, or tamale-stuffed turkey.

An increasing number of families give mom and grandma a break by dining at a hotel's Thanksgiving buffet. Others forgo the long process of stuffing the turkey and baking it for six hours; they're deep frying it in hot oil. Some even prepare a turducken, a boneless turkey stuffed with a boneless duck wrapped around a boneless chicken with dressing.

Take time to reconnect with your loved ones, express your thankfulness and reflect on memories.

Indian Pudding for Thanksgiving Day

When anyone mentions the month of November, we usually think of Thanksgiving Day. But every single day of the month is designated as a National Day (Week or Month) to recognize a food that we either love or hate.

National Fig Week is always the first week. Pecans, peppers, pomegranates and peanut butter have month-long recognitions. Each of the thirty days celebrates a product or preparation like mousse, cashews, pickles, pizza or vichyssoise.

November 13 is National Indian Pudding Day. The pudding is made with cornmeal and was really the creation of the settlers who didn't have flour to make their familiar hasty pudding.

Indian Pudding is still pop-

ular in the New England states, but it isn't commonly made elsewhere, though it's likely the most American of all.

Jasper White's recipe has been reprinted many times; he is a renowned Boston chef.

Jasper White's Indian Pudding

2 and 1/2 tablespoons unsalted butter
3 cups milk
5 tablespoons yellow cornmeal
1/3 cup molasses
1/3 cup maple syrup
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 egg, beaten
1 cup cold milk

Preheat oven to 300°F. Grease 1 1/2 quart baking dish with 1 tablespoon of butter; set aside. Heat 3 cups milk in a saucepan until it is close to boiling.

Add cornmeal and reduce heat to low. Whisk until it thickens (5 minutes). Remove from heat and add remaining butter, molasses, maple syrup, cinnamon, ginger, salt and egg.

Pour into the buttered dish. Bake for 30 minutes. Pour the cold milk over the hot pudding and return to the oven. Bake for 1 hour and 30 to 45 minutes more, until the top is brown and crisp.

Serve hot or warm with topping of 2 pints premium vanilla ice cream, whipped cream or light cream. Serves six to eight.

Acoustics draw choir to Yuengling's cave

They weren't the usual sort of tourists, the group of 24 men setting up chairs and sound gear in the damp, dimly lit caves beneath America's Oldest Brewery.

"You have to be where you can see me," Dan Forsberg said after they had assembled in two rows. "But if you happen to be in a place where it's dripping, move an inch or two."

Moments later, a chorus of voices rises, drowning out the sound of trickling water and almost seemed to warm the dank chamber. Then the warm-up verse ends.

"It's still going. It's still going," Forsberg declared. "It's somewhere out over the hill."

The Eintracht Singing Society of New Castle, Pa., a 25-member men's a Capella choir, took over the former storage caves beneath D.G. Yuengling & Son Inc. on Monday morning to enjoy the acoustics of the closed rocky tunnels and make a recording that will eventually be for sale in the brewery gift shop.

Founded in 1894, the society preserves a tradition of singing and fellowship begun by German speakers from Transylvania.

"It was originally formed by immigrants who came here and wanted to continue their own language," Lee Winter, New Castle, the choir president, said.

Such cultural societies founded by European ethnic groups were once common in America and even now there are several in the Pittsburgh area; however, "nobody sings like us," Winter said.

"It's our heritage," Forsberg, New Wilmington, the choir director, said. "We're keeping it alive. We're people who have come to know our common background. It's something in the DNA. It strikes a chord. It says 'this is what I like.'"

Timothy W. Womer, society secretary, said he figured it would bring him closer to his German heritage if every week he could read the language and hear it. He said the choir happened upon such an inviting venue. In April 2013, members were invited to Harrisburg to sing in the state Capitol. While in the region, they thought they might pay their respects to a non-singing regular at their weekly meetings — Yuengling beer, which is on tap at their hall.

"We had the bus for the day and we figured we would have some fun," Womer said.

On that tour, as they walked through the caves, the acoustics caught the attention of Forsberg, who asked a seemingly puzzled tour guide if they could stop and sing for a few minutes. The result was a request to use the caves for a recording.

"We're grateful (Yuengling) would let us interrupt the tour — let us take over this piece of the cave for a while," Forsberg said.

Before Monday's session began, Forsberg offered a prayer, thanking God for the gift of song

and voice. The men lifted their voices in "Ein Prosit," a toasting song often heard at Oktoberfest — and old movies — replacing "Gemuetlichkeit" with "to Yuengling Beer." Folksongs included "Das Morgenrot," "Es bliesse ein Jager," and especially the slightly bouncy "Gluck Auf Steiger-Marsch," which represents the good luck wish miners cry out passing each other at the entrance of their mines.

"It's the title song for our album," Forsberg said.

There was English as well, starting with "The Star Spangled Banner," using an arrangement Forsberg came up with, the "Whiffenpoof Song" and "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

While working on that Christmas hymn, Forsberg exhorted the choir to exercise restraint and enjoy "the intimacy of sound," which the unusual surroundings afford.

"Usually we are in these awful banquet halls and have to fill out the space, and belt it out," he said.

Later, he explained their usual venues, including their hall in New Castle, built in 1904, is "like Kleenex boxes. Here, we don't have to be so bombastic. I can hear so much better than at the hall."

In contrast to the timeless nature of the Eintracht Society's music is one inescapable

characteristic of the group, the age of the members.

"The bulk of us are above 60," Winter said. There are several in their 80s and, one member, who alternated between sitting in the front of the group and standing with the help of a cane, is a bit older than that. Adam Pivovar will celebrate his 97th birthday Nov. 30.

Many of the members are longtime singers — Forsberg has been doing it for 25 years — while some are newer, like Womer. His cousin, member Gerry Holzhauser, got him involved eight years ago.

Yet, it is hard to draw new members, especially younger men.

Dan Reiber, New Castle, president of the society, knows why.

"They lack the time," he said.

Yet, as he described the Gemuetlichkeit of weekly meetings, where the singers sit in a semicircle, with a chair opposite each other, upon which they set their beer and schnapps and sheet music, where birthdays are celebrated and heritage comes to life, he makes it sound like time well spent.

The new CD, "Gluck Auf" will be available for sale in just a few weeks, just in time for Christmas presentation for family and friends.

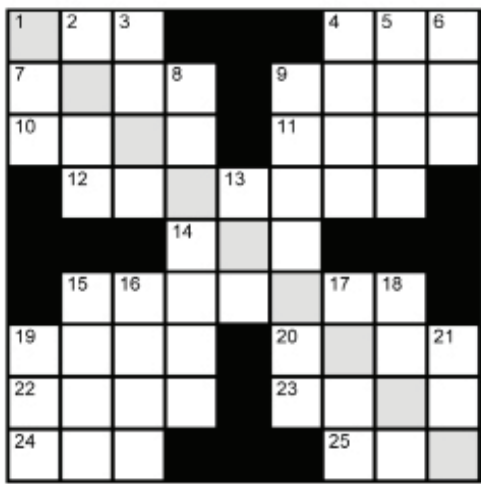

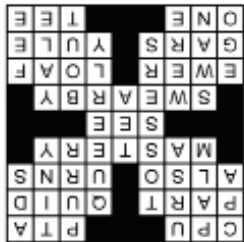

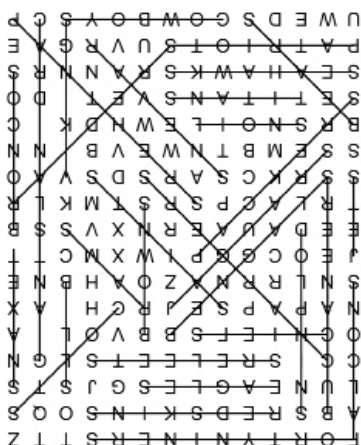

It's open season for Medicare Advantage

You can generally switch Medicare Advantage plans during fall enrollment: October 15 to December 7. You can also switch to a plan with a five-star quality rating anytime during the year, though those plans aren't available in all states.

You can also switch to traditional Medicare any time within 12 months of first joining a Medicare Advantage program.

After that, you must wait for open enrollment to switch coverage for 2015. Make sure your doctors are included in the Medicare Advantage programs you are considering.

Traditional Medicare covers more doctors, but first make sure you can also get a Medigap policy, which covers Medicare deductibles and other coverage gaps.

You could be rejected or charged more for Medigap because of your health if it has been more than six months since you first signed up for Medicare Part B.

You'll also need to buy a Medicare Part D policy during open enrollment for prescription-drug coverage if you switch to traditional Medicare. Visit www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan.
